Tribute to PD James

It was with sadness that we learned of the death of the marvellous author **Phyllis Dorothy James, Baroness** James of Holland Park, OBE, FRSA, FRSL, who kindly spoke at our Fundraising Dinner in April this year. Phyllis was born in Oxford in 1920. From 1949 to 1968 she worked in the National Health Service and subsequently in the Home Office, first in the Police Department and later in the Criminal Policy Department. All that experience was used to great effect in her highly successful and much praised novels. She was a Fellow of the Royal Society of Literature and of the Royal Society of Arts and served as a Governor of the BBC, a member of the Arts Council, on the Board of the British Council, and as a magistrate in Middlesex and London. She was an Honorary **Bencher of the Honourable** Society of the Inner Temple. She won awards for crime writing in Britain, America, Italy Scandinavia. and She received honorarv degrees from seven British 4



universities, was awarded an OBE in 1983, and was created a life peer in 1991. In 1997 she was elected President of the Society of Authors.

When we heard her entertaining talk at our Dinner in April, she spoke about how she was learning to cope with the progressive challenges of dry macular degeneration. She clearly approached her visual impairment with great fortitude and determination. Her charm and good humour shone through very strongly and we are most grateful to her for honouring our event. Her husband died in 1964 and she is survived by their daughters, Clare and Jane, five grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

Meet the team: Mary Gregory

In this edition, we'd like to focus on our longest serving member of staff, who many of you will know, Mary Gregory.

When Mary joined OAB in 1977, the charity had very few members of staff. Mary was the new Crafts Officer.

In days, those craft workshops for people with visual impairments were the norm. They created woven cane rims for trays, knitted dishcloths and made pot scourers and peg bags. One man made willow baskets, another assembled while wooden stools. With this little cottage industry thriving, someone had to sell it all. So Mary spent her weekends travelling all over the county - to steam rallies, village fairs and shows, and local bazars. On one occasion she and a helper put up a tent at a steam rally, then disappeared inside it to shelter from the pouring rain, with sandwiches and a bottle of homemade wine for cheer. A considerable time later, they peeked out to

discover the tent was alone in the middle of the field, surrounded by water, and requiring rescue by a tractor. Mary describes these as 'wonderful years'.

As time passed, the craft classes became social groups, and Mary became OAB's Groups Worker. Along the way, she demonstrated specialist visual impairment equipment, ran Information Days, and organised holidays where visually impaired people could have a break in specialist hotels at seaside resorts.

Today, as the charity's parttime Groups Worker Mary is still the key link person back to OAB for people all over Oxfordshire. She supports eight social groups that mostly meet fortnightly, delivering the next year's large print diaries and calendars, picking up talking watches that need new batteries and organising visits to OAB's resource centre. Mary runs one of the groups herself and has done

for many years.

Mary remains hugely enthusiastic about the charity's work, and is often turned to for the knowledge and experience she has built up over 37 years of service.


CCTV for you?

At Bradbury Lodge we have a range of electronic magnifiers, commonly known as CCTVs because they are a closed circuit in that the camera usually feeds directly to a screen. These magnifiers are quite large and require adequate table space in order to be used properly. However, for some visually impaired people they are an invaluable aid to independence allowing keep up them to with personal correspondence, newspaper articles, read etc. Indeed some artists with sight loss use them to carry on with their creativity. Most of the CCTV magnifiers we have are on loan from the UK suppliers in order that we can demonstrate them to clients. However, occasionally we do have them donated to us and, once we have had them checked for safety, place them with clients who would find them useful. 
